Central Washington Nonprofit Formed to Create Regional Apprenticeship Readiness Program

RICHLAND, Wash. – A new Tri-Cities-based nonprofit will create an accredited pre-apprenticeship training program to generate opportunities in the building trades industry for low-income and historically underserved central Washington populations, including women and minorities.

The Central Washington Building Pathways nonprofit aims to build a new and diverse talent pipeline by ensuring individuals are prepared and successful in formal apprenticeships to replace an aging construction workforce and meet the region's labor demands.

The nonprofit's inaugural board meeting was Nov. 13 at 2 p.m., the first day of National Apprenticeship Week. Founding directors of the board include:
